4. Details of our assessment

On the 30th November 2021 Natural Resources Wales Officers Phil Harper (Industry & Waste Regulation Officer) and Cathrine Kiely (Senior Industry & Waste Regulation officer) visited Gofer Bulking Station, Old Gofer Site, Rhuddlan Road, St George, Abergele, LL22 9SE.

Weather conditions were overcast but dry.

F1 Odour

At the time of the visit there was a South Westerly wind. A faint odour was observed outside the site boundary immediately North East of the site. The site has an approved odour management plan, and the level of odour was sufficiently low to not cause complaint.

Permit condition **3.3.1** states the following “**Emissions from the activities shall be free from odour at level likely to cause pollution outside the site, as perceived by an authorised officer of the Environment Agency, unless the operator has used appropriate measures, including, but not limited to, those specified in any approved odour management plan, to prevent or where that is not practicable to minimise the odour**”.

A **category 4 breach** has been applied.

Action: Ensure that the odour management plan is adhered to, and that any occurrences of odour and actions taken are recorded.

G4 Reporting and Notification to Natural Resources Wales

At the time of the visit the site was without phase 3 power due to Storm Arwen. Therefore, bailers were out of action, affecting the operation of the site. It is also of the understanding of NRW that roller shutter doors which are used to secure the transfer building when the site is unoccupied were significantly damaged.

During the visit the site diary was checked. The site diary had been filled out to the standard required by the permit, including entries regarding the loss of power.

A building which is left unsecure while unoccupied and a reduced ability to process waste has the potential to cause pollution. Permit condition **4.3.1 (a)** states that “**The environment Agency shall be notified without delay following the detection of any malfunction, breakdown or failure of equipment or techniques, accident or emission of a substance not controlled by an emission limit which has caused, is causing or may cause significant pollution.**”

Failure to notify Natural Resources Wales has resulted in a **category 3 permit breach**.
