The annual reports for 2016 were received on 2nd February 2016.

Form S1, Emissions to Sewer, 1st January 2016 to 31st December 2016

All the parameters were within their respective emission limit values.

The permit requires the quarterly reporting of flow to be expressed as total flow per day in m³ and also as the maximum flow rate in m³ per hour. However, Continental Teves always report flow as a total over the reporting period. This is accepted by Natural Resources Wales as we believe it is a more useful measure, particularly when calculating mass releases to sewer.

Form E1, Energy Usage 2016

Both primary energy and CO₂ production were 8% less than in 2015, despite higher production volumes.

Form R1, Waste Disposal and Recovery 2016

Total hazardous waste production was 11% less than in 2015. Non-filtercake waste was 20% less, but filtercake waste increased by 6%. This was presumably due to the product mix during 2016.

Form WU1, Water Usage 2016

Total water usage increased by 20% in 2016 and water used per unit output increased by 23%. This was because more products were made using the zinc-nickel process, which uses more water per part plated.

Form MR1, Mass Releases 2016

The mass release of cadmium was slightly higher than in 2015, whereas the mass release of mercury was significantly reduced. These values are calculated and so may not necessarily be completely accurate.

It is disappointing to see such a significant increase in water use in 2016. The reasons given by Continental are valid and accepted by Natural Resources Wales, but we would like Continental to investigate ways of reducing water consumption during 2017 and report their findings as part of the annual reports for 2018.

The reduction in energy consumption during 2016 is most encouraging and we hope that this will be maintained during 2017.
