**Biomass UK No.2 Ltd. Incinerator, Barry Dock**

**Environmental Permitting Regs. 2013    Application number: PAN-000869**

We are concerned you call this "an energy generation facility" rather than "a waste installation generating energy", so may not treat it with due seriousness.

We hear you apologised that your officers *"did not inform local political leaders as planned and local residents were not specifically notified"* over the licensing consultation. We live near to the Incinerator site, yet you have still not notified us. Jane Hutt AM is arranging a meeting, but nothing from the NRW.

The dust and pollution from this plant would affect the whole area, while the noise is likely to be disturbing night-time. The stocks of combustible waste wood-chips contain paint and significant amounts of plastic. Fires from wood-chip stores have burned for days on Newport Docks and at Coity/Bridgend, emitting nauseous fumes. We live as close or closer to proposed Biomass wood-store. Are you requiring the company to demonstrate that accidental wood-chip fires cannot happen here?

We ask you for full information, including a public exhibition with public question-and-answer session on how you would propose to license this polluting, bad-neighbour operation. We are happy for the DIAG group (Docks Incinerator Action Group) to liaise with you over suitable arrangements.
