This site inspection was carried out on Thursday 04 July 2019 by Natural Resources Wales officers Ross Briscoe (Senior Environment Officer) and Philip Harper (Environment Officer).

Present was Lee Jones and Sonia Jones of World Care (Wales) Limited.

Weather conditions throughout the visit were dry, sunny and mild.

The visit had been prearranged in advance and was undertaken in order to assess progress made to address the previously identified non-compliances.

The site was open; however no waste management duties were taking place whilst officers were on site.

On arrival officers proceeded to the site office. Within the office, regulating officers were informed of further progress that had been made over the previous month – further infrastructure and site drainage works, introduction of staff welfare facilities and the updating of documented procedures.

Officers observed WAMTIAB training being provided to site operatives within the site offices.

No waste material or empty skips were observed outside of the permitted area.

Contractors were on site carrying out further work on repairing the site security fence at the rear of the site.

The highway outside the site was free from any mud/debris and appeared to have been recently swept by the new road sweeping equipment.

No issues were noted relating to noise, odour, litter or pests throughout the inspection.

Several non-compliances did remain which are outlined below.

Photographs were taken throughout the inspection.

Non-Compliance

B3 - Infrastructure - Site drainage engineering (clean and foul), Permit Condition 2.1.2, Compliance Classification Scheme Category 3 breach.

The site drainage system is not compliant with the requirements of the site permit. Officers observed that in areas of the site where wastes were being stored, sections of the drainage infrastructure were incomplete, notably around the plasterboard waste bay and the mixed waste stockpile bay. Condition 2.1.2 (Table 2.1) sets out the standards for the site drainage system which must be complied with. This breach of permit condition has been recorded as a minor category 3 noncompliance. Please ensure that these works are carried out to the required standard as soon as possible ensuring that the regulating officer is kept informed of progress.

C3 - General Management - Materials acceptance, Permit Condition 1.1.4, Compliance Classification Scheme Category 3 breach.

Wastes on site are not being appropriately stored within skips and bays as required by permit condition 1.1.4. The unprocessed mixed waste stockpile and the stockpile of plasterboard waste are not being stored within skips and bays constructed in accordance with condition 2.1. This breach of this permit condition has been recorded as a category 3 non-compliance. Please keep the regulating officer updated with progress towards completing this necessary works.

C4 - General Management - Storage, handling, labelling and Segregation, Permit Condition 4.6.1 (Table 4.6), Compliance Classification Scheme Category 3 breach.

Within Table 4.6 (Condition 4.6.1), requirement 'e' specifies that combustible wastes are only permitted if stored in bays

provided with an impermeable surface and sealed drainage system. Degradable household wastes (mixed waste stockpile) are required to be stored in areas with impermeable pavement and sealed drainage and either stored in sealed containers; or stored in covered shelters or roofed areas; or stored in bays – this was not taking place on site. You must ensure that the wastes specified within Table 4.6 are stored in accordance with the requirements set out within Table 4.6. This breach of permit condition has been recorded as a category 3 non-compliance.

The regulating officer discussed the above with site management whilst on site. Officers were informed that work would continue over the coming days and weeks in order to meet the requirements. Officers advised that details of work to be undertaken including timescales for completion should be forwarded on for consideration.

To summarise the following non-compliances have been recorded.

B3 – Category 3 breach – 4 CCS points

C3 – Category 3 breach – 4 CCS points

C4 – Category 3 breach – 4 CCS points

Total number of CCS points recorded for site inspection on 04 July 2019 – 12.

The total number of CCS points for the 2019 compliance year so far is 84.1. This at present places you within compliance band E.

Please keep the regulating officer aware of progress on site over the coming weeks.
