The results for the latest Site Monitoring and Protection Plan were received on 6th November 2014. After reviewing the report Natural Resources Wales (NRW) made the following observations and requested that the actions below are carried out.

1. "The SPMP findings are confirmed by other monitoring carried out on site. This problem should be addressed as a matter of urgency and a plan of action sent to NRW by 28th February 2015;
2. The Royal Mint should try to identify the origin and pathway of the metals that contaminate BH001 and inform NRW of the findings and actions proposed to reduce or control the problem;
3. Please supply NRW with the proposed start and end dates for the identification and sealing of redundant culverts and the cleaning of those that are still in use."

NRW received a reply for item 1 on 23rd February 2015 and for item 3 on 2nd March 2015.

1. There is an on-going programme for removal and replacement of redundant plant. As part of this process, possible sources of contamination are identified and investigated. The results of planned maintenance will be reviewed weekly and any areas for concern will be addressed.
3. Funding has been approved to carry out the necessary works in the next financial year, which starts in April 2015. The work is likely to be carried out in the summer, depending upon rainfall.
2. This will be addressed in May/June 2015.

These replies are satisfactory and are accepted.

Action: Please supply a report to update NRW on the findings of the various investigations by 30th June 2015.
