4. Details of our assessment

AWD operate a waste transfer station under a Standard Rule Permit (SR2008No3) at the Byass works site permit number EPR-AB3895C.

During the visit NRW officers were accompanied around the site by Company Director Alun Wyn Davies and David Morgan of AWD Group.

General observations:

The site was busy but well organised. Good segregation of waste was observed, and effective management practices were in place. The operator is intending to submit a permit variation in the near future to reflect the changes to waste operation they wish to make. A recent permit variation to extend the permitted area was accepted.

Hazardous waste:

There were 3 x 660l wheelie bins full of sharps containers present in the quarantine area. David Morgan explained that they were awaiting movement of site to SRCL Limited but there had been delays moving them off site. Linda Warrick (NRW) said that she would contact SRCL to see what was causing the delay.

*Update David Morgan informed NRW that the sharps had been removed from site and provided a hazardous waste consignment note as evidence. There were issues with the consignment note but these will be addressed in a separate correspondence.

There is concern about the quantity of sharps boxes received at the site. Whilst it is believed the ones observed during this visit were brought in by another company (for which enforcement is still being considered) Alun Wyn Davies explained a number were being received mixed in with the plastic waste from Local Authorities. Whilst these usually are spotted during the picking process and a non-conformity is reported, it is still a concern. It was difficult to gauge the quantity received due to the presence of the existing sharps boxes but now they are gone a record must be collated.

ACTION: please send NRW data that AWD group have collected over the last two years on the quantities of sharps boxes and producer of waste and any follow up correspondence you have had with the sites/Local Authority it comes from.
