After signing in and undertaking introductions with PJ, DH and RC, GJ returned to car to don PPE.

The site inspection started with YARD 1 at the Shank Press and banded area containing vertical tanks (3 for Aqueous Process, 3 for Ash Washing and Silo for dual use).

JOHN FORD providing lorry and skip.

Discussed site security . . . no problems reported as security is good.

We then entered the PRESS HOUSE where the presses were working.

Looked in the Green container GJ noted that a lot of cabling and instrumentation had been removed.

DAF plant still present and working.

GJ appreciated Ozone skid partially removed then left the PRESS HOUSE.

Within Yard 1 GJ acknowledged a fire hose (for fire mitigation) and traffic cones (for traffic management) were in available.

People (4 of) left Yard 1 and walked down Old Clipper Road (OCR) to Yard 2, upon entering Yard 2 GJ was shown the location of the MCERTS flow monitoring instrument. The fitting of this instrument was an improvement condition (completed week Nov 2016). GJ photographed.

Yard 2 also contained a small number (approx. 10) empty and washed IBCs.

The group (4 of) then left Yard 2 and walked down OCR to Yard 3.

Upon entry GJ was immediately impressed with how empty Yard 3 appeared. Yard 3 contained a NEW SHED (known as SHED 3) for the storage of recycled aggregate and an extension to the hopper to allow flexibility for the BATCHING PLANT.

Since the last visit there had been improvements made to the DRUM STORAGE infrastructure (internal front wall stored acids, internal rear divided into 3 bays

Left hand bay > > quarantine area

Middle bay > > IBC alkali storage

Right hand bay > > drum reception area

DRUM STORAGE INFRASTRUCTURE was an improvement condition (completed week 1 Jan 2017).

Each of these 3 bays have independent bunding and their own sumps.

Facing wall is for IBC washing.

Exited Yard 3 then moved onto Yards 4 and 5 (unpermitted areas) not storing waste.

On return to main site office GJ commented that the best he had ever seen it due to low number of drummed and IBC waste. An excellent result given the state of the site when initially occupied by CWSL.
