NOTICE OF MODIFICATION OF CONDITIONS OF WASTE

MANAGEMENT LICENCE NUMBER 152/87.

WHEREAS on 4th November 1987 a disposal licence was issued under Section 5 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 to Castle Cement Limited, relating to the landfilling of controlled wastes at Castle Cement Ltd, Padeswood Works, Clwyd (Minute Number 270, dated 10th September 1987 refers), subject to the conditions set out therein AND that under the requirements of Section 77(2) of the above Act this disposal licence shall be treated as a waste management licence as defined by Section 35 of the Act.

NOTICE is HEREBY GIVEN that the Alyn and Deeside District Council modifies the said conditions as follows:

Add new conditions 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 attached.

This modification is to take effect at 00:01 hours on 20th March 1995

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

7. A record shall be made of the types and quantities of waste deposited in the site. The record shall include details of :-

- i) The date of deposit,
- ii) the type of waste, and
- iii) the quantity of waste.

8. A monthly summary of the record required to be made by condition 7 of this licence shall be made. This summary record shall include the following details for each waste type deposited at the site:-

- i) Waste type, and
- ii) Total quantity per waste type.

9. Copies of the monthly summaries required to be made by condition 8 of this licence shall be forwarded to the Waste Regulation Authority within the month following that to which the records relate. The address to which the records shall be sent is:-

10. The records required to be made by conditions 7 and 8 of this licence shall be kept securely within the site offices at Castle Cement (Padeswood) Limited and shall be made available for inspection by authorised officers of the Waste Regulation Authority at any reasonable time.

The licence holder shall keep these records for the duration of the site licence unless otherwise authorised in writing by the Waste Regulation Authority.

11. The total quantity of wastes deposited at the site in any calendar year (1st January to 31st December) shall not exceed 24 900 (twenty four thousand nine hundred) tonnes.

Should you wish to appeal against these modifications then you may do so to the Secretary of State under Section 43 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. Regulation 6 (Notice of appeal) of the Waste Management Licensing Regulations 1994 requires that an appeal shall be made by notice in writing and that the notice shall be accompanied by:-

- (a) a statement of the grounds of appeal;
- (b) a copy of the relevant waste management licence;
- (c) a copy of any correspondence relevant to the appeal;
- (d) a copy of any other documentation relevant to the appeal including, in particular, any relevant consent, determination, notice, planning permission, established use certificate or certificate of lawful use or development; and
- (e) a statement indicating whether the appellant wishes the appeal to be in the form of hearing or to be determined on the basis of written representations.

The appellant shall also serve a copy of their notice of appeal on the waste regulation authority together with copies of the documents detailed above. An appeal should be made within 6 (six) months of the date of the decision which is the subject of the appeal although the Secretary of State may allow notice of appeal to be made following the expiry of this period.

Please note that the above information is for guidance only.
