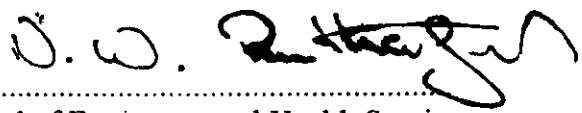

### Notes

These notes are for general guidance and they do not constitute authoritative statement of the law.

Futher details of licensing provisions, offences, appeals etc., can be found in the Control of Pollution Act 1974.

Definitions of certain words used in this licence are to be found in the latter part of this licence.

This licence relates only to the requirements of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 for the deposit of waste and the use of plant or equipment subject to the conditions set out in the Schedules and does not constitute a consent required by any other legislation. In particular it is the responsibility of the licence holder to comply with any requirements of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, the Radioactive Substances Act 1960, the Town and Country Planning Act, and all relevant water protection and environmental health legislation.

If the licence holder ceases to occupy the land specified above, then he may transfer the licence to the new occupier after giving notice to the Waste Disposal Authority who has the right to decline to accept the new licence holder.

If the licence holder wishes to cancel this licence, he must return it to the Waste Disposal Authority together with a notice stating he no longer requires the licence. Cancellation of the licence will not affect any outstanding liability of the licence holder under the conditions of the licence.

### Contravention of Licence Conditions

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 3, 9 and 16 of the Control of Pollution Act, 1974.

Section 3 - Prohibits under penalty the deposit of waste, or the use of plant or equipment, otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the licence. This Section applies to all the conditions contained herein, including any which may be the subject of appeal to the Secretary of State under Section 10 of the Act.

Any deposit which takes place without compliance with all the licence conditions may lead to prosecution under this Section. A person who contravenes Section 3 subsection (1) shall, subject to subsection (4) be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of an amount not exceeding £2,000 (at the date of issue of this licence), or on conviction on indictment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or a fine or both.

Section 9 - Non compliance with any licence conditions may lead to the revocation of this licence.

Section 16 - The licensing authority is empowered to require the removal of any controlled waste deposited in circumstances where any of the conditions contained in this licence are not being complied with, or the undertaking of such works as are required to reduce or eliminate the consequences of such deposits.

THE CONTROL OF POLLUTION ACT 1974 - WASTE DISPOSAL LICENCE CONDITIONS  
FOR SCRAP YARD AT STATION ROAD, GREENFIELD

1. General

- 1.1 The statement of intended methods of operation and attached Drawings dated 16th March 1992 contained within the document entitled Operational Working Plan and Statement of Intent for Scrap Yard at Station Road, Greenfield (Chadwicks) and dated 15th January 1993 shall be referred to as the Working Plan and shall form part of this licence.
- 1.2 Prior to any operations taking place under the terms of this licence the Working Plan shall have been approved in writing by the Waste Regulation Authority (W.R.A.). The licence holder shall obtain written approval from the W.R.A. for any proposals accepted in the Working Plan, as altered by any previous changes approved by the W.R.A., before such change is implemented.
- 1.3 Any reference in this licence to the Working Plan shall include a reference to any amendment to the statement or the Drawings which have been accepted in writing by the W.R.A. as appropriate.
- 1.4 Subject to the terms of this licence, the facility shall be operated in accordance with the Working Plan, attached to this licence as Appendix B.
- 1.5 This licence shall relate to the area of land edged round in red on Drawing No. 1.5.29 of the Working Plan and this area will be henceforth called "the site". No deposit of waste shall take place outside the area of land edged round in red on Drawing No. 1.5.29 of the Working Plan.
- 1.6 Prior to any operations taking place under the terms of this licence the working plan shall have been approved in writing by the Waste Regulation Authority (hereinafter referred to as W.R.A. throughout these conditions). The licence holder shall obtain written acceptance from the W.R.A. for any proposed changes approved by the W.R.A, before such change is implemented.
- 1.7 Any reference in this licence to the working plan shall include a reference to any amendment to the statement or the drawings which have been accepted in writing by the W.R.A. as appropriate.
- 1.8 Subject to the terms of this licence, the site shall be operated in accordance with the working plan.
- 1.9 Acceptance by the Authority of the Working Plan shall not relieve the licence holder of its responsibility to ensure that any or all of the following do not occur:
  - (i) pollution to the environment;
  - (ii) harm to human health;
  - (iii) serious detriment to the amenities.
- 1.10 All constructional details included in the working plan and/or included in the conditions of this licence shall, unless otherwise stated, be undertaken and completed within three months of the date of issue of this licence. All other requirements shall commence upon receipt of these conditions.

- 1.11 The deposit of waste material shall only take place within the area outlined in red on the attached Drawing No. 1.5.29.
  - 1.12 The types of waste for which storage and/processing is authorised, and any limitation as to the quantity to be treated or stored is specified in Appendix A of this licence. Appendix A also contains a list of the types of waste specifically excluded from the site.
  - 1.13 Solid wastes only shall be accepted for storage or processing at the facility and the wastes shall not contain any hazardous quantity or concentration of poisonous, noxious or polluting substances. No waste liquids or sludges shall be accepted at the facility.
2. Site Preparation
- 2.1 A site identification board of durable material and finish with a minimum dimension of 1 m x 1 m shall be erected in a prominent position at the entrance to the site. The board shall display the following information:-
    - (i) Name of the site and a telephone number for contacting the site operator in cases of emergency.
    - (ii) Details of hours when the site is operational.
    - (iii) The words "Site Licensed in Accordance with Part I of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 by Delyn Borough Council, Environmental Health Services Department, Telephone Flint 762345".
  - 2.2 The gates at the site entrance shall be locked closed when the site is unmanned to prevent unauthorised access. All damage which impairs their effectiveness shall be repaired as soon as practicable and in any case within 48 hours.
  - 2.3 The site boundary fencing and walls detailed in the attached Drawing No. 1.5.29 shall be maintained in good order. Daily inspections shall take place of fencing and walls and any damage to the fencing or walls which would impair their effectiveness shall be repaired as soon as practicable and in any case within 48 hours. Details of any defects found shall be recorded in the site diary.
  - 2.4 A site control office shall be provided, and maintained in good order at the location detailed in the Working Plan. Telephone facilities shall be provided and maintained in good order at the site control office during working hours.
  - 2.5 A copy of the disposal licence and any relevant working instructions shall be held at the site control office and made known to the site supervisor, who shall ensure compliance with this licence and its conditions.
  - 2.6 Waste shall be delivered to and removed from the facility only between the hours of 08.00 a.m. and 05.00 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and 08.00 a.m. and 03.00 p.m. on Saturdays. Except in case of emergency, no delivery, removal or processing of wastes shall take place outside these hours or on Sundays, Bank Holidays or Christmas Day without the prior acceptance of the W.R.A.

- 2.7 Lighting as detailed in the Working Plan shall be provided, maintained and used for those operations which are to be carried out during the hours of darkness, as defined by the statutory lighting up times published by the Science Engineering Research Council.
- 2.8 The facility shall be manned and supervised as detailed in the Working Plan during operating hours. Supervisors must be able to identify the general categories of waste allowed by this licence.
- 2.9 Liquids used for the operation and maintenance of site equipment shall be stored only in tanks or drums which are bunded to contain spillages. The bund and its base must be of type and construction as to provide an impermeable barrier, capable of impounding 110% of the capacity of the largest tank or drum. The tanks and/or drums shall be of a type and construction suitable for the liquids they contain, labelled to show their contents, and conform to all relevant safety standards. Any misleading labels shall be removed. All fill and drain pipes and valves shall be within the curtilage of the impermeable bund.
- 2.10 If leakage is found to be occurring, the tank or drum shall be repaired immediately and replaced within 7 working days. All spillages are to be removed within 3 working days after the repair or replacement of the drum or tank, and taken to an appropriately licensed facility, accompanied by any relevant documentation in compliance with Section 17 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974.

### 3. Site Operation

Waste material shall only be accepted for deposit at the site in accordance with the reception procedures detailed in the Working Plan.

- 3.1
  - (a) No waste material shall be burnt on the site. An outbreak of fire on the site shall be regarded as an emergency and immediate steps taken to extinguish it. All outbreaks of fire shall be notified immediately to the W.R.A. and a record kept within the site diary.
  - (b) For the purposes of this condition the use of gas cutting equipment shall not be regarded as the burning of waste materials.
  - (c) The W.R.A., shall be informed as soon as practicable, and in any case within twenty four hours, of any incident, that could give (or has given) rise to danger to public health, pollution of water, or could be (or has been) seriously detrimental to local amenities.
  - (d) The licence holder shall notify in writing, to the W.R.A., the name and designation of the owner's site supervisor and the name and designation of alternative nominated persons and subsequently notify the W.R.A. immediately of any changes to these personnel.
  - (e) The terms of this licence and working plan shall be made known to the site supervisor or nominated persons.
- 3.2 In this licence, an emergency is defined as a case where a person has reasonable cause to believe that circumstances exist which are likely to endanger life or health or cause damage to property or pollution of water.

- 3.3 A quantity or concentration of any substance contained in any waste is regarded to be hazardous if that substance is present in that waste in such a quantity or concentration as to subject persons or animals to material risk of death, injury or impairment of health, or as to threaten the pollution or contamination (whether on the surface or underground) of any water supply.
- 3.4 The total quantity of waste accepted daily shall not exceed the operational capability of the facilities available on site as detailed in the working plan. If the total quantity of waste accepted daily exceeds the operational capability of the facilities on site, the W.R.A. may:
- (a) Apply conditions limiting the quantity of waste accepted daily until such time that adequate additional facilities have been provided and agreed upon by the W.R.A;
  - (b) Require the operator to provide additional facilities to ensure that waste is properly disposed of.
- 3.5 A written record shall be kept of all controlled waste deposited and removed from the site as detailed in the Working Plan. These records shall be open to inspection by the Waste Regulation Authority, at the site office, during working hours.
- 3.6 A summary of the characteristics and quantities of waste deposited at and removed from the site, over the 12 months period preceding 31st March in every calendar year, shall be submitted to the W.R.A., before the 30th April of that year and shall include such information as district of origin of waste, carrier registration number, licence number of facilities waste is taken to, site inspections, sump monitoring, unpermitted wastes etc.
- (a) The contractor shall employ the best practical means to minimise NOISE AND VIBRATION produced by his operations and shall have regard to the recommendations in BS 5228: 1984 "Noise Control and Construction and Open Sites" or any subsequent BS amending, updating or replacing BS 5228.
  - (b) All vehicles and mechanical plant used for the purpose of the Works shall be fitted with effective exhaust silencers and shall be maintained in good and efficient working order.
  - (c) Machines in intermittent use shall be shut down in the intervening periods between work or throttled down to a minimum.
- 3.7 Litter shall not be allowed to accumulate at the facility. Not less frequently than at the end of each working day any litter which may be lying at the facility shall be gathered and disposed of to a suitably licensed facility.
- 3.8 Measures shall be taken to ensure that mud, debris or any other material is not deposited on any highway by vehicles leaving the facility.
- 3.9 The site shall be inspected at a minimum of one monthly intervals for infestation by insects and vermin. Disinfestation measures shall be commenced within 24 hours of discovery of insects and vermin, and treatment continued until the infestation is removed.

- 3.10 A site diary shall be kept at the site office, in which the data referred to in these conditions shall be kept. The site diary be available for inspection by a duly authorised officer, of the W.R.A., during working hours.
- 3.11 An impervious hard standing for engine dismantling and materials that may contain liquids shall be constructed and maintained as detailed in the Working Plan. This area will be drained to a blind sump which will be emptied and disposed of to an appropriately licensed facility. The sump will be covered when not in use so that rainwater cannot accumulate within the sump.
- (a) All liquids stored prior to disposal shall be stored within an impermeable bund with a capacity of at least 110% of the volume of the largest container situated therein. All containers used for the storage of liquids shall be suitably labelled to describe the contents therein. Any misleading or inappropriate names, marking, or other identifications shall be obliterated.
  - (b) Rain and surface water accumulating within any bunded area or sump shall be removed and treated, in accordance with Condition 2.10.
  - (c) Any spillages shall be dealt with immediately to clear or alleviate the effect of the spillage. Adequate quantities of sand/absorbent material shall be kept on site and used on appropriate spillages.
- 3.12 No polluting matter shall enter any watercourse, sewer, or underground resource except with an appropriate consent.
- 3.13 After undergoing the reception procedure, wastes shall be directed to the appropriate storage area. Any wastes found to be unacceptable by virtue of Appendix A shall be stored in the area detailed in the Working Plan and shall be removed to a suitably licensed facility within 72 hours.
- 3.14 Ferrous materials shall be stored in areas 1 through 5 and as shown on Drawing No. 1.5.29.
- 3.15 Non-ferrous materials shall be stored within skips or other suitable containers located in area shown on Drawing No. 1.5.29 both prior to and after sorting.
- 3.16 Engines from cars, lorries etc., shall be stored in skips or other suitable containers in the area marked on Drawing No. 1.5.29. Engines delivered to the site shall not be drained. They are stored in a bunded area.
- 3.17 Batteries (from cars, lorries etc.) shall be stored in skips or other suitable containers in the area marked on Drawing No. 1.5.29. Batteries delivered to the site shall not be drained. They shall be stored in a bunded area.
- 3.18 Electrical equipment shall be stored within the buildings marked Metal Store in the storage area marked on Drawing No. 1.5.29.

4. Definitions

- 4.1 Waste Regulation Authority (W.R.A.) shall mean Delyn Borough Council, Delyn House, Chapel Street, Flint, Clwyd.
- 4.2 Duly Authorised Officer shall mean any person authorised in writing by the W.R.A. pursuant to Section 91(1) of the Control of Pollution Act 1974.
- 4.3 Licence Holder shall mean the person or persons to whom this licence is granted.
- 4.4 Biodegradable shall mean material which may be broken down by the action of micro-organisms.
- 4.5 The Act shall mean the Control of Pollution Act 1974 and as amended.
- 4.6 Environmental Hazard shall have the meaning contained in Section 4(5) of the Control of Pollution Act 1974.
- 4.7 Bund shall mean a constructed area of impervious material capable of containing any liquids herein.
- 4.8 Operating shall mean the deposit of waste or acceptance of waste for deposit and all matters incidental thereto.
- 4.9 Site Diary shall mean a daily record of all site operations as required and specified in these conditions.
- 4.10 Operational Capability. The quantity of waste handled daily at the site which can be landfilled to the standards required by this licence using the plant, manpower, cover material and other facilities available on site.
- 4.11 Drawing No. 1.5.29 relates to Drawing (A) in the Working Plan Statement of intent.

APPENDIX A

Types of Waste Permitted for Deposits

1. Cars/Vehicles
2. Electrical cable
3. Electrical equipment
4. Engines
5. Ferrous swarf
6. Machinery
7. Non-ferrous swarf
8. Oil
9. Ferrous metals
10. Non-ferrous metals
11. Tyres
12. Batteries

Materials Not Permitted onto the Site

1. Polychlorinated biphenyl and polychlorinated terphenyl
2. Any waste defined as a Special Waste in accordance with Section 17 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974, except those permitted by conditions within the Licence.
3. No biodegradable and or putrescible wastes shall be deposited at the site.
