**NOTICE OF MODIFICATION OF


WHEREAS on 21st December 1990 you were granted a Waste Disposal Licence, licence number WD038, by the Preseli Pembrokeshire District Council relating to land at Milford Haven identified on drawing number M98-0/004533.

AND WHEREAS on 1st May 1994 the said Disposal Licence converted to a waste management licence pursuant to Section 77 (2) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 ("the 1990 Act)

NOTICE is HEREBY GIVEN that the Environment Agency modifies the said conditions as detailed in Appendix A attached. These modifications shall take effect from 00.01 hours 18th March 2002.

N.B.- The person served with this notice may under Section 43 of the 1990 Act appeal against the Agency's decision to the Secretary of State within six months of the date of the decision or such longer period as the Secretary of State may allow.

Appendix A

Appendix A, Condition 13 paragraph (d) previously read 'No special waste as defined in section 17 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 and regulations made thereunder shall be deposited at the site'

Appendix A, Condition 13 paragraph (d) shall now read 'No special waste as defined by regulation 2 of the Special Waste Regulations 1996 or any statutory provisions or regulations amending or replacing them shall be deposited at the site except for wastes containing hydrocarbons produced in accordance with the other requirements of this condition'

Appendix A, Condition 17 previously read 'not less frequently than once in each year succeeding the date of this licence samples of the soil shall be taken from the working area of the site and analysed for all those elements compounds and substances which are named in licence condition number 15'.

Appendix A, Condition 17 shall now read 'not less frequently than once in each year succeeding the date of this licence samples of the soil shall be taken from the working area of the site and analysed for all those elements compounds and substances which are named in licence condition number 14'.

Rights of appeal

Section 43(1) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 provides that, where except in pursuance of a direction given by The National Assembly For Wales,

- a licence is granted subject to conditions

the applicant may appeal from the decision to The National Assembly For Wales.

Therefore if you feel aggrieved by the decision or any of the conditions to the licence as granted you may obtain the appropriate form on which to give written notice of an appeal from:

This notice of appeal should be accompanied by the following information:

- a statement of the grounds of appeal
- a copy of the licence
- a copy of any correspondence relevant to the appeal
- a copy of any other document relevant to the appeal including, in particular, any relevant consent, determination, notice, planning permission, established use certificate or certificate of lawful use or development
- a statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or on the basis of written representations.

You are also required to serve a copy of your notice of appeal together with copies of any of the above documents that have accompanied your notice of appeal, on the Environment Agency (at the address overleaf). You should appeal within 6 months of the date that this notice takes effect but The National Assembly for Wales may allow notice of appeal to be given after the expiry of this time period.
