NOTICE OF MODIFICATION OF WASTE MANAGEMENT

LICENCE NUMBER 197/95

WHEREAS on 17th March 1995 a waste management licence was issued under Section 36 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 to AD Waste Limited, relating to the keeping of controlled wastes at Globe Way Civic Amenity Site, Globe Way, Buckley, Deeside, Clwyd (Minute number 5, dated 22nd February 1995 refers), subject to the conditions set out therein.

NOTICE is HEREBY GIVEN that Alyn and Deeside District Council modifies the said conditions as follows:-

Delete conditions A1, C4, C6, C8 and Appendix 2(1)(i)(c) and substitute new conditions A1, C4, C6, C8 and Appendix 2(1)(i)(c) attached to this notice.

Add new condition B12 attached to this notice.

This modification is to take effect at 00:01 hours on Monday 26th February 1996.

IMPORTANT - PLEASE REFER TO NOTES OVERLEAF

Should you wish to appeal against these modifications then you may do so to the Secretary of State under Section 43 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. Regulation 6 (Notice of Appeal) of the Waste Management Licensing Regulations 1994 requires that an appeal shall be made by notice in writing and that the notice shall be accompanied by-

- (a) a statement of the grounds of appeal;
- (b) a copy of the relevant waste management licence;
- (c) a copy of any correspondence relevant to the appeal;
- (d) a copy of any other documentation relevant to the appeal including, in particular, any relevant consent, determination, notice, planning permission, established use certificate or certificate of lawful use or development; and
- (e) a statement indicating whether the appellant wishes the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or to be determined on the basis of written representations.

The appellant shall also serve a copy of their notice of appeal on the waste regulation authority together with copies of the documents detailed above.

An appeal should be made within 6 (six) months of the date of the decision which is the subject of the appeal although the Secretary of State may allow notice of appeal to be made following the expiry of this period.

Please note that the above information is for guidance only. Should you wish to make an appeal you are strongly advised to obtain a copy of the Waste Management Licensing Regulations 1994 (S.I. 1994 No. 1056, ISBN 0-11-044056-0) and refer to regulations 6 to 9 for full details of the appeal procedure.

'A1. Area Covered by the Licence.

These licence conditions shall only apply to the site shown hatched black on the plan attached at Appendix 1 (one) to this licence. The licence conditions do not apply to any waste management operations on the site which are exempted from licensing by virtue of Regulation 17 of the Waste Management Licensing Regulations 1994 (S.I. 1994 1056) (or any subsequent replacement legislation).'

'C4. Asbestos Waste.

Cemented asbestos sheets shall only be accepted at the site if they are intact and in a non-friable condition. These sheets shall be deposited, stored and removed from the site in accordance with the agreed Working Plan. Any skip containing asbestos shall be sheeted over, except when wastes are being deposited in it, until the asbestos has been completely covered with other wastes at which time the skip may remain unsheeted.'

'C6. Special Wastes.

a.) Vehicle batteries.

Waste lead acid vehicle batteries received at the site shall immediately be placed in a bunded container provided in accordance with condition B10 of this licence.
No more than 20 (twenty) vehicle batteries shall be stored at the site at any one time.

Should 10 (ten) or more vehicle batteries be removed from the site at any one time then their removal shall be in accordance with the Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980 (S.I. 1980 No. 1709) (or any subsequent replacement legislation). Any such removal shall be recorded in accordance with condition F1 of this licence.

b.) Other Special Wastes.

All other Special Wastes received at the site shall immediately be placed in a secure container provided in accordance with condition B12 of this licence and in accordance with the methodology detailed in the agreed Working Plan.

A record shall be made of each waste placed into the secure container and this record shall detail the type of waste (if known), the type and size of container holding the waste and the date and time of the deposit of the waste. Whenever the site is open this record shall be available for inspection by officers of the Authority responsible for the regulation of this waste management licence.

The removal of any such wastes shall be in accordance with the Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980 (S.I. 1980 No. 1709) (or any subsequent replacement legislation). Any such removal shall be recorded in accordance with condition F1 of this licence.'

'C8. Maximum Duration of Waste Storage.

No wastes deposited into skips shall remain at the site for longer than 48 (forty-eight) hours.

Wastes deposited in a secure container in accordance with condition C6 (b) to this licence shall be stored at the site for no longer than 28 (twenty-eight) consecutive days.

All other waste items deposited at the site shall be stored for no longer than 7 (seven) consecutive days.'

Appendix 2(1)(i)(c)

'SPECIAL WASTES as defined by the Control of Pollution Act 1974 and the Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980 (S.I. 1980 No. 1709) (or any subsequent replacement legislation), produced on household premises only and which are only to be deposited in accordance with condition C6 of this licence. No Special Wastes shall be accepted from any other sources.'

'B12. Storage of Special Wastes.

All Special Wastes other than lead-acid vehicle batteries shall be stored in a suitable dedicated and lockable container as specified in the agreed Working Plan. The acceptance and storage of such wastes shall be in accordance with the methodology detailed in the agreed Working Plan. The storage container shall always be locked whenever the site is unmanned.'
