CIRIA C736

Your permit has a standard condition that states:

All liquids in containers, whose emissions to water or land could cause pollution, shall be provided with secondary containment, unless the operator has used other appropriate measures to prevent or, where that is not practicable to minimise, leakage and spillage from the primary container.

In our 'How to Comply with your environmental permit' (HTC) we reference two guidance documents that provide information on pollution prevention and appropriate measures associated with secondary containment i.e. CIRIA R163D (Concrete Bunds for Oil Storage Tanks Masonry Bunds for Oil Storage Tanks) and CIRIA R164 (Design of containment systems for the prevention of water pollution from industrial incidents). However, both guidance documents have been superseded by CIRIA C736 (Containment systems for the prevention of pollution). [Item Detail \(ciria.org\)](http://ciria.org).

We will be updating 'How to Comply' in the near future. In the meantime we expect you to follow CIRIA C736 in complying with the condition outlined above, typically condition 3.2.3 of your environmental permit.

Rights of appeal

If you are not happy with any permit condition that has been imposed by the variation you may appeal to the Welsh Ministers. If you want to appeal any condition imposed as a result of your application you must make your appeal no later than six months from the date of the variation notice. If you want to appeal any condition we've added as an Natural Resources Wales initiated variation you must make your appeal no later than two months from the date of the notice.

The documents are:

- a statement of the grounds of appeal;
- a copy of any relevant application;
- a copy of any relevant environmental permit;
- a copy of any relevant correspondence between the appellant and the regulator;
- a copy of any decision or notice which is the subject matter of the appeal; and
- a statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or dealt with by way of written representations.

You may withdraw an appeal by notifying the Welsh Ministers in writing and sending a copy of that notification to us.

Following the UK's departure from the EU on 31 January 2020 and the end of the transition period on 31 December 2020, the legal obligations relating to compliance with environmental permits and legislation will continue to apply. NRW will continue to issue and regulate all permits and licenses in line with our current practice.
