**Environmental Protection Act 1990 Section 59(1)(a) notice -
Removal of illegally deposited controlled waste at Gwendraeth Valley
Recycling Limited, former Cynheidre Colliery, Five Roads.**

On Friday, 23 January 2015 I visited the Gwendraeth Valley Recycling Limited transfer station at the former Cynheidre Colliery where I met with Mr. Lyndon Tillman and Mr. Howard Tillman. Also present were Mr. Keith James and Ms. Laura Dagless of Carmarthenshire County Council. I was pleased to note that work had begun on removing the controlled waste (including rubble, soils and hardcore) that has been deposited outside the area authorised by the company's environmental permit (EPR/KP3698VB).

Please find enclosed a notice issued pursuant to Section 59(1)(a) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. The purpose of the enclosed notice is to ensure that the remaining illegally deposited controlled waste is either removed from site or moved into the permitted area within an acceptable timescale.

It was agreed with Mr. Lyndon Tillman during my site visit on 23 January 2015 that this work would be completed by the end of the summer. The company must therefore ensure that the required work is completed by **28th August 2015**. Failure to comply with this notice may result in us taking legal action against the company. Should the company become aware that it may not fully comply with this notice, you must contact us immediately.

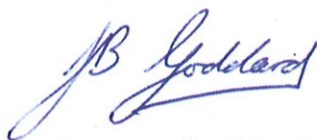

Under Section 59 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 (as amended), Natural Resources Wales can require the removal of controlled waste or extractive waste.

Being satisfied that controlled waste, namely construction and demolition waste including rubble, soils and hardcore has been deposited outside the permitted area (EPR-KP3698VB) at the former Cynheidre Colliery, Five Roads, Llanelli, Carmarthenshire SA15 5YN as shown highlighted in blue on the attached plan referenced GVR1, in contravention of Section 33(1) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 (as amended).

Natural Resources Wales requires the company to remove the above mentioned waste by **12 o'clock midday on Friday, 28th August 2015.**

General

- 2 If you fail to comply with this notice, Natural Resources Wales may take the steps and recover from you any expenses reasonably incurred in so doing.
- 3 Failure to comply with this notice is an offence under Section 59 (5) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990, as amended, and may result in legal action being taken against you.

Appeal provisions

You are entitled to appeal against this notice under Section 59(2) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990, as amended. Notice of appeal must be made within a period of 21 days beginning with the service of this notice to a Magistrate's Court by way of a complaint. The requirements of this Notice shall have no effect pending the determination of the appeal.
