A review of the waste returns for permit number EPR-YP3894FR has been completed. Condition 6.2.2 of your permit requires you to submit within the end of one month of the end of each quarter (using the form made available for the purpose), the information specified on the form relating to the site and the waste accepted and removed from it during the previous quarter. Unfortunately, we have not received the waste returns for quarter 4 2015 and quarters 1, 2 and 3 2016.

As a direct result of this permit breach a site warning has been issued on this form along with the application of a CCS score 4 against condition 6.2.2 and a separate CCS score 4 which has also been applied against the management condition 1.1.1 of your permit.

You are required to submit the missing waste returns for quarter 4 2015, quarters 1, 2, and 3 2016 and quarter 2 2017 to waste.returns@cyfoethnaturiolwales.gov.uk no later than the 5th September 2016. You are also required to ensure an effective management system is implemented no later than the 5th September 2017 to prevent this breach of your permit conditions from occurring again in the future.

Could I also take this opportunity to remind you that the waste returns for Q3 2017 are due to be submitted to us by the end of October 2017. A copy of the latest waste returns submission form has been attached for your use.
