This was an unannounced inspection by the new regulating officer for the site Steven White who met with site manager David Williams.

Following a discussion with David Williams about the site and his concerns regarding other permitted sites an inspection of the permitted area at HK Motors Minera was carried out, below is a summary of the visit:

The yard where the depolluted ELV's are stored is predominantly covered with hardstanding, this area drains to an interceptor towards the bottom of the site. At the time of the visit there were 19 ELV's on site (12 x cars, 4 x lorries and 3 x ambulances - see picture below)



3 x ambulances observed on site

During the inspection of the above vehicles it was observed that a number had not been fully depolluted: 2 of the cars still had some of the fluids in them; and 2 had not had the batteries removed (see photo below). This was brought to the attention of David Williams who ensured that they would be dealt with that day.

Condition 2.4.1 of the site permit states 'The storage and treatment of waste motor vehicles shall meet the requirements of article 6(1) of the End of Life Vehicles Directive'.

Section 3.3.6 (a) and 3.3.6 (b) of the site Working Plan describes the treatment activities on site and includes the removal of the battery and drainage of the fluids from the vehicle prior to its storage on the yard.

As there were a number of vehicles that had not been fully depolluted on site this has subsequently been scored as a C3 CCs breach against the permit.

You must ensure that all vehicles are fully depolluted before they are stored on the yard.

It was raining quite heavily at the time of the inspection and a small amount of oil was observed running from the vehicles on the yard; however this was collected by the site interceptor and no oils were observed below this. You must ensure that the interceptor is checked on a regular basis, emptied when necessary and logged in the site diary.
