Emissions to Surface Water

Q1 2019 (January - March 2019) monitoring results from emission point W1 assessed. Parameters monitored for were flow, pH, COD, Iron, Chromium, Mercury, Nickel, Zinc and Ammonia. All emissions to water from point W1, below permitted emission limit values.

Emission from point A41, elevated Zinc at 9.1ppm on 17/2/2019, explanation accepted that this was a false result.

Pump Control Failure and Exceedance of Flow Emission Limit

On 12 June 2019, part A notification received following telephone call with Tata, this confirmed that there had been a pump failure on Tata's drainage channel and heavy rainfall had caused treated effluent to flow into council drainage channel at the Brocken Bank drain. Agreement sought with NRW to run pumps for an extended period over the 4 hour permitted time period in order to repair pump.

13 June 2019, further pump failure on council drainage channel pumps, permission was sought from Tata to open the sluice gate between Council drainage channel and Tata's drainage channel to allow all drainage at Brocken Bank (Tata and Council) to be discharged via Tata's metered pumps to avoid risk of flooding. This was agreed with NRW. Permitted maximum flow limit of 15,000m³ was exceeded for a limited period. Part A notification was raised on 17 June 2019 for the days that flow rate limit was exceeded with flows of:-

Friday 14th - 17,652m³

Saturday 15th - 19,793m³

Sunday 16th - 18052m³

NRW agreed the request to extended discharge period and exceedance of 15,000m³ daily discharge limit. Due to limited environmental impact and the serious risk of flooding, no breach of permit or score given for these time periods.

Emissions to Air

On 23 May 2019, following discussion on site, a part A notification was received for emissions to air from the Haden Regenerative Thermal Oxidiser (RTO). The RTO was run in bypass for a 4 hour period during essential repair to the RTO exhaust. An agreement was reached with NRW that this could occur for 4 hour period to allow the coating line to remain in operation and avoid potentially higher emissions to air from the shut down and start up of the line. No breach of permit noted for this agreement period.
