This was an un-announced inspection to assess compliance with the environmental permit held by CRL, reference EPR/UB3998FB. This was also the first site visit since the variation was issued for the treatment of waste codes 16 02 14 and 17 04 11 via cryogenic freezing using dry ice – CO₂.

Site Tour

Activities on site remained as per normal operations, large electrical equipment is accepted and dismantled in to its component parts for recovery off site. PCB-contaminated material is treated within the building.

During the site tour AW explained the treatment process of the PCB contaminated material on site and the process that is undertaken. Electrical cables were also being stored on site within the building.

Cryogenic Treatment

The cryogenic treatment process has not been undertaken since the permit variation was issued. The site is currently busy and doesn't have the available space to undertake this treatment activity. DR explained that the trials that were undertaken using CO₂ proved very effective in enabling the bitumen encrusted material to be removed from certain electrical equipment. CO₂ was also more effective than the use of liquid Nitrogen. The current process for removing bitumen takes a lot longer and requires the pro-longed use of flame cutting equipment to heat the waste and then allow the bitumen to drain out.

No treatment has been undertaken of SF₆ contaminated material.

Daily Checks

The daily checks were inspected to ensure that they are being carried out at the required frequency. Jonathan Lewis demonstrated the system that is used and was able to provide a copy of the daily checks for the previous nine operational days. These can be seen below.
