Any non-compliance we have identified and recorded on this form is an offence. It can result in criminal prosecution and/or suspension or revocation of your permit.

We are currently considering taking enforcement action against you for the non-compliance recorded above. We will contact you in due course.

4. Details of our assessment

An Operator Monitoring Assessment audit for emissions to air was undertaken on 02 December 2021.

The OMA highlighted a number of issues relating to procedures, staff responsibilities, competency and understanding of permit monitoring requirements.

Policies and procedures do not accurately reflect the requirements of the permit and actions that may be needed following any monitoring, there is also uncertainty around certain areas of responsibility.

When reviewing the CEMS DAHS in the control room, this showed that the calibration functions following the QAL2 campaigns in both February and May 2021 had not been applied. Tradebe confirmed via email on the 21 December 2021 that they had not been applied and this would be actioned immediately. A further visit to site on 19 January 2022 identified that the calibration function had still not been applied. The correct calibration functions were applied later that day. It is considered that the root cause of this is a combination of lack of understanding with regard to requirements of BS EN 14181 and the permit, actions not being documented in procedures, responsibilities not clearly identified and inadequate training provided.

The lack of adequate procedures and management of the CEMS, including the updating of the calibration functions has been scored a CCS2 breach of Condition 1.3.

The lack of training for key personnel meaning they are unaware of the actions required following monitoring campaigns has been scored a CCS3 breach of Condition 2.3.2 and 2.3.3

Action 1: Investigate why the calibration functions were not updated and report back by the 28 February 2022.

Action 2: Review all monitoring and reporting procedures relating to CEMS and DAHS to ensure they reflect permit requirements, BS EN 14181 and roles and responsibilities. The procedures should explicitly include the need to update calibration functions. Procedures should be provided to NRW by 31 March 2022.

Action 3: Provide suitable training to those staff identified within the revised procedures and document this. Evidence of staff training to be provided to NRW by the 31 March 2022.

Action 4: Review audit procedures and ensure internal audits are undertaken that include reviewing emissions monitoring and permit compliance. These should be provided to NRW by the 31 March 2022.

As a result of the calibration functions not being applied correctly the emissions data submitted for the majority of 2021 is incorrect.

Action 5: Resubmit all 2021 emissions data following the input of the correct calibration

function onto the CEMS DAHS by the 28 February 2022.

Any emissions breaches will be dealt with separately following resubmission of the data.

Issues were identified with the sampling platform. The unsealed ports and debris on the platform from nearby duct works should be rectified. **This has been scored a CCS4 breach of Condition 2.10.10.1.**

Action 6: Ports shall be fitted with covers to ensure an effective seal. Evidence showing this has been completed should be submitted to NRW by the 31 March 2022.

Advice & Guidance: It is recommended that the Operator introduce routine platform inspections before monitoring activities take place and ensure the platform remains clear of debris.
