**ENFORCEMENT NOTICE TO TAKE SPECIFIED STEPS IN RELATION TO A
BREACH/ANTICIPATED BREACH OF PERMIT CONDITION(S)**

Natural Resources Wales considers that the following conditions of the environmental permit are being contravened:

Condition 1.1.1 – The operator will manage and operate activities in accordance with a written management system

because

In relation to the above condition;

- Section 7 of the Environmental Management System titled 'Storage of Wood with Specified Properties or Forms' outlines the waste storage requirements for the site, which includes the following requirements:

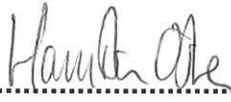
"Separation from another wood stack or chipped wood stack should not be less than 6 meters in width (Section 7.1 Raw Wood Waste Processing and First Stage Recycling).

Horizontal separation between stacks should be not less than 6 meters (Section 7.2 Chipped Wood and Sawdust Stack Piles)."

During inspections on site on 13/10/14, 08/08/14 and 16/05/14 measurements of distances between stacks were taken. Separation between a number of stacks are 4 – 4.5 meters. You must ensure all wood waste stacks are separated by a horizontal distance of at least 6 meters.

You are required to take the steps set out in Schedule 1 by the date(s) specified in order to remedy the contravention.

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Notes:

General

1. Failure to comply with this notice is an offence under Regulation 38(3) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2010 and may result in legal action being taken against you.
2. Without prejudice to the requirements of this notice, failure to comply with a condition of an environmental permit is an offence and may result in legal action being taken against you.
3. You may wish to seek independent legal advice.

Appeal provisions

You are entitled to appeal against this notice under Regulation 31(2)(f) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2010. Notice of appeal must be made within two months of the date of this notice. An appeal does not affect the requirements of this notice.

At the same time you must send a copy of the appeal notice and documents to us.

The required documents are:

a statement of the grounds of appeal;
a copy of any relevant application;
a copy of any relevant environmental permit;
a copy of any relevant correspondence between the appellant and the regulator;
a copy of any decision or notice which is the subject matter of the appeal; and
a statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or dealt with by way of written representations.

You may withdraw an appeal by notifying Welsh Ministers in writing and sending a copy of that notification to us.

Further information about making an appeal and the forms that you will need are available from the Environmental Protection Division.

In this document 'Natural Resources Wales' means the Natural Resources Body for Wales established by Article 3 of the Natural Resources Body for Wales (Establishment) Order 2012.

You should note that the Natural Resources Body for Wales has been formed by bringing together the Countryside Council for Wales, Forestry Commission Wales and Environment Agency Wales.
