### Introductory note

#### This introductory note does not form a part of the notice

The following notice gives notice of the variation of an environmental permit.

This administrative variation is to add waste codes 03 01 01, 03 01 05, 15 01 01, 15 01 02, 15 01 06, 17 01 01, 17 01 02, 17 02 01, 17 02 02, 17 02 03, 17 04 07, 17 06 04, 17 08 02, 17 09 04, 20 03 02 to the existing permit. These additional waste types do not change the nature of the activity or increase risk at the site, based on waste types already accepted and existing permit condition requirements.

## 2 - OPERATIONS

### 2.3 Operating techniques

- 2.3.1 (a) The activities shall, subject to the conditions of this permit, be operated using the techniques and in the manner described in the documentation specified in schedule 1, table 2.3, unless otherwise agreed in writing by Natural Resources Wales.
- (b) If notified by Natural Resources Wales that the activities are giving rise to pollution, the operator shall submit to Natural Resources Wales for approval within the period specified, a revision of any plan or other documentation ("plan") specified in schedule 1, table 2.3 or otherwise required under this permit which identifies and minimises the risks of pollution relevant to that plan, and shall implement the approved revised plan in place of the original from the date of approval, unless otherwise agreed in writing by Natural Resources Wales.

### 2.4 Improvement programme

- 2.4.1 The operator shall complete the improvements specified in schedule 2 table 2.4 by the date specified in that table unless otherwise agreed in writing by Natural Resources Wales.
- 2.4.2 Except in the case of an improvement which consists only of a submission to Natural Resources Wales, the operator shall notify Natural Resources Wales within 14 days of completion of each improvement.

### **3 – EMISSIONS AND MONITORING**

#### **3.8 Fire**

- 3.8.1 The operator shall manage and operate the activities in accordance with a written fire prevention plan using the current, relevant fire prevention plan guidance.
- 3.8.2 The operator shall:
- (a) if notified by Natural Resources Wales that the activities could cause a fire risk, submit to Natural Resources Wales a fire prevention plan which identifies and minimises the risks of fire;
  - (b) Operate the activity in accordance with the fire prevention plan, from the date of submission, unless otherwise agreed in writing by Natural Resources Wales.
