Waste regulation

We regulate waste management through a system of licences. Find out how to get the correct licence here, get data on waste and find out if there are any rules applying to household waste.

Waste facts and figures

The UK produces about 220 million tonnes of controlled wastes per year. Find out about waste incineration, hazardous waste, recycling and landfill.

Active and Historic Landfill Layer

Our active landfill layer holds details of sites that are regulated by us. Our historic landfill layer holds details of sites that have surrendered their environmental permits or were identified as being closed before the formation of the Environment Agency.

Definitions

Sites designated with codes A1-A7 were originally regulated under the Waste Management Licensing Regulations and the majority of which are closed as they are not compliant with the Landfill Directive.

A1: Co-disposal landfill site

A landfill site that disposed of both non hazardous and hazardous waste in the same cells.

A2: Other landfill sites taking special waste

A landfill site that disposed of hazardous wastes only.

A4: Household, commercial and industrial waste landfill

A landfill site that disposed of both non hazardous biodegradable and non-biodegradable wastes only.

A5: Landfill taking non-biodegradable wastes

A landfill site that disposed of non-biodegradable non hazardous wastes.

A6: Landfill taking other wastes

A landfill site that disposed of other wastes not listed in categories A1, A2, A4 and A5. An example could be dredgings from waterways.

A7: Industrial waste landfill (factory cartilage)

A landfill site that disposed of wastes from the operator only or a specific organisation or source. Wastes could be both non hazardous or hazardous wastes.

L05: Inert Landfill

Landfill sites originally permitted as installations. Legislative amendments changed these to waste operations. These

are landfill sites that are Landfill Directive compliant and can operate now.

Landfill sites permitted as installations accepting non hazardous and/or hazardous wastes that are Landfill Directive compliant and can operate now.

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
