**ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT 1990 - PART II, SECTION 37**

**NOTICE OF MODIFICATION OF  
WASTE MANAGEMENT LICENCE**

WHEREAS on 30<sup>th</sup> April 1993 a Waste Disposal Licence was granted under Section 5 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 (number 180/93) by Alyn & Deeside District Council relating to The Transport Yard, Old Aston Hill, Ewloe, Flintshire

NOTICE is HEREBY GIVEN that the Environment Agency in exercise of its powers under Section 37 (1)(a) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 modifies Waste Management Licence No: 180/93 as follows:

# SCHEDULE

The following condition shall be deleted from Waste Management Licence No. 180/93 M R Jacksons  
**Conditions D3(a), D3(b), I3, I4 & Appendix 4.**

The original conditions read:

D3(a) A record shall be kept of all conductivity measurements and all analyses of contaminated waters arising from the site in accordance with the requirements of condition I3 of this licence. The record of each such analysis shall include a summary interpretation of the results.

D3(b) A copy of the records of conductivity measurements and of analyses of contaminated waters arising from the site taken in accordance with condition I3 of this licence shall be submitted to the Environment Agency monthly within two weeks of the end of the next calendar month.

I3 Monitoring and analysis of potentially contaminated water from site

(a) Surface water conductivity

The conductivity shall be measured weekly of all surface water arisings which pond on the site for more than 24 hours.

(b) Oil interceptor discharge analyses

(i) Conductivity measurements

During the draining of any oil onto the oil drainage area the discharge point of the interceptor system shall be inspected for any discharge of water. Should any water be being discharged then its conductivity shall be measured weekly

(ii) Analysis of samples

Biannually the functioning of the interceptor system shall be tested by flushing the oil drainage area with water until water is discharging from the system. The water discharge shall be sampled and analysed for the parameters listed in Appendix 4 to this licence.

(c) Records of conductivity measurements and analyses of samples of contaminated waters arising from the site.

Records shall be kept of all such conductivity measurements and analyses of samples of contaminated water arising from the site in accordance with condition D1 of this licence.

I4 Removal of contaminated water from the site

(a) removal of contaminated waters

Should the results from the analyses required by condition I3(b) of this licence indicate that the discharge water is contaminated then no further oil shall be drained into the system and the entry of rain water shall be prevented until the contents of the interceptor system have been removed by a suitably registered waste carrier to a suitably licensed waste disposal or treatment facility and the interceptor system has been modified and the modification accepted in writing by the Waste Regulation Authority and the National Rivers Authority (Welsh Region).

(b) Records of removal of contaminated waters

Records shall be kept of all removals of contaminated waters in accordance with condition D1(b) of this licence.

The following condition shall be amended in Waste Management Licence No. 180/93 M R Jacksons

**Conditions G3, I1, I2, J1(b) & Appendix 2(a) part 7**

The original conditions read:-

### G3 Drainage of Oils

The drainage of oils from vehicle engines, gear boxes and differentials shall only take place over the specially constructed drainage area as detailed in the working plan.

The discharge water from the oil interceptor system shall be sampled in accordance with condition I3 of the licence.

### I1 Drainage onto or from land

#### (a) Surface water run off

Should surface water run off from the site occur, then it shall be channelled to a suitable drainage system constructed to the agreement of the NRA (Welsh Region) and details of its construction shall be incorporated into the working plan at that time.

#### (b) Discharge of surface water

No such water shall be discharged to any water course without the written permission of the National Rivers authority (Welsh Region)

### I2 Discharge to Drains, Sewers or Watercourses

No waste, or water contaminated with waste, shall be discharged or allowed to enter any drain, sewer or watercourse other than in accordance with a consent issued by the National Rivers authority (Welsh Region) in case of watercourses or Welsh Water PLC in the case of drains and sewers.

A copy of any such consent shall be provided to the Waste Regulation Authority prior to any discharge being carried out.

### J1(b) Drainage from Concrete Surface Storage Area

All surface water drainage from the concreted storage area required by condition J1(a) of this licence shall be directed to an oil interceptor system. The discharge water from the oil interceptor system shall be sampled in accordance with condition I3 of this licence.

### Appendix 2(a)

#### 7. Draining of Oil from Waste Equipment

The draining of oils on site shall only be undertaken over the approved draining area constructed to the satisfaction of the National Rivers Authority (Welsh Region), as detailed in the working plan.

The amended conditions shall read:-

### G3 Drainage of Oils

The drainage of oils from vehicle engines, gear boxes and differentials shall only take place over the specially constructed drainage area as detailed in the working plan.

I1 Drainage onto or from land

(c) Surface water run off

Should surface water run off from the site occur, then it shall be channelled to a suitable drainage system constructed to the agreement of the Environment Agency and details of its construction shall be incorporated into the working plan at that time.

(d) Discharge of surface water

No such water shall be discharged to any watercourse without the written permission of the Environment Agency

I2 Discharge to Drains, Sewers or Watercourses

No waste, or water contaminated with waste, shall be discharged or allowed to enter any drain, sewer or watercourse other than in accordance with a consent issued by the Environment Agency in case of watercourses or Welsh Water PLC in the case of drains and sewers.

A copy of any such consent shall be provided to the Environment Agency prior to any discharge being carried out.

J1(b) Drainage from Concrete Surface Storage Area

All surface water drainage from the concreted storage area required by condition J1(a) of this licence shall be directed to an oil interceptor system which shall be designed, constructed, inspected, validated and maintained, and shall be fully documented and recorded, to be fit for purpose and to meet the standards specified in Table J1 below:

<b>Table J1 Site containment and drainage standards</b>	
<b>Type of Site Containment and Drainage</b>	<b>Minimum Specified Standards of Design, Construction and Maintenance</b>
Drainage systems	A 3 chamber oil interceptor, which shall have a minimum of six minute retention time per chamber at its maximum flow rate shall discharge to either a foul sewer or sealed sump, shall be inspected no less frequently than weekly and after rain, and shall be maintained so as to intercept all liquids which run off the pavement.
Inspection and maintenance of engineered containment	The sealed drainage system: a) shall be inspected no less than weekly, to ensure the continuing integrity and fitness for the purpose of their construction, and the inspection and any necessary maintenance shall be recorded in the site diary; and b) in the event of any damage occurring which breaches the integrity of the engineered containment so that it no longer meets the specified standards, the Licence Holder shall cease importing waste into or treating waste in the affected area, shall notify the Agency immediately, and shall not recommence importing waste into or treating waste in the affected area until it has been repaired to a standard at least as good as the original specification.

## **RIGHTS OF APPEAL**

Section 43(1) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 provides that:

Where, except in pursuance of a direction given by the National Assembly for Wales,

- a** an application for a modification of the conditions to a licence is rejected; or
- b** the conditions of a licence are modified;

then the applicant for the modification of the licence or, as the case may be, the holder of the licence may appeal from the decision to the National Assembly for Wales.

Therefore if you feel aggrieved by the decision or any of the conditions to the licence as modified you may obtain the appropriate form on which to give notice of an appeal from:-

This notice of appeal should be accompanied by the following information: a copy of the licence; a copy of any correspondence relevant to the appeal; a copy of any other document relevant to the appeal including, in particular, any relevant consent, determination, notice, planning permission, established use certificate or certificate of lawful use or development; and a statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or on the basis of written representations. You are also required to serve a copy of your notice of appeal, together with copies of any of the above documents that have accompanied your notice of appeal, on the Environment Agency (at the address below). You should appeal within 6 months of the date that this notice takes effect but the National Assembly for Wales may allow notice of appeal to be given after the expiry of this time period.
