Routine site inspection conducted by Environment Officer Leon Williams accompanied by Griffith Wyn Griffiths and Gwenfai Rees Griffiths.

No on site operations were ongoing at the time of the visit. All waste deposited within the sites' permitted boundary was seen to be in compliance with the conditions of the permit.

A number of waste transfer of notes were inspected in the site office, all of which contained the required information.

As highlighted, the WAMITAB certificate for Edward Lloyd Griffiths will be expiring in February 2016, so please make arrangements for the continuing competency certificate to be obtained.

Outside the site boundary, an area of land, approximately 50 sq. metres in size, was seen to have been raised using soil and clay type waste from a development in the local area. Griffith Wyn Griffiths explained that this work had been undertaken under a U1 exemption. The purpose of this work was to raise the level of the land in order to reduce surface water runoff flowing towards the landfill and down towards the watercourse that runs through the site. The development will also be used to create a new access track down to the permitted area. The U1 exemption specifically allows suitable waste to be used for the purpose of construction, i.e. constructing a hard standing or track way. This exemption does not allow waste to be used for land reclamation.

I believe that the development observed on site during the inspection is a land reclamation activity as the gradient of the land has been increased and in order to construct a track way, the amount of material, estimated to be a 1000 tonnes, would not have been required purely to construct a track way. In order to reduce the risk of sediment pollution entering the watercourse that runs through the site I believe it would have been more appropriate to construct bunds near the watercourses banks. I therefore do not believe that the activity is compliant with the U1 exemption, however as you have been previously advised by Officer Andrew Smith when he visited the site in 2013 that the work was in compliance with the exemption, we do not on this occasion intend to take any further enforcement action.

I advise that in the future, any separate waste related activity is kept separate to the permitted operations on site. Exempt waste activities must not encroach onto the permitted site. Please keep Natural Resources Wales up to date with any such proposals/developments at the site.
