4. Details of our assessment

Environment officer Robert Andrews attended in response to two complaints WIRS numbers 2107877 and 2107887. The complaints mentioned both dust and noise coming

from site. There were no breaches substantiated in regards to dust but noise was substantiated as a breach of the permit. The officers findings are detailed below.

F2 – Amenity Noise. Category 3 breach.

Permit condition 3.1.1 states that ‘Emissions from the activities shall be free from noise and vibration levels likely to cause pollution outside the site, as perceived by an authorised officer of Natural Resources Wales, unless the operator has used appropriate measures, including, but not limited to, those specified in any approved noise and vibration management plan to prevent or where that is not practicable to minimise the noise and vibration.’

'Arrived at 1 Castell Mynach Cottages, Groes-faen CF72 8NB at 1.15pm. Subsequently, I assessed the noise and dust complaint from the address. There was small plumes of dust visible on the yellow project site, deriving from the movements of materials-notably the inert waste pile. However, there was no evidence that this dust was leaving the site. There was different types/levels of noise coming from the yellow project site. There was generic construction noises from the vehicles excavating, dumping and moving materials around the site. However, there was also louder processing noises coming from the site. The noise was similar to the noise a conveyor belt/crusher makes. I would class it as low impact category 3.

I drove to site and updated Mr Oakes on the report and he agreed to accompany me to Castell Mynach Cottages to assess the report himself. We then drove to the area and I captured another video to record the noise, Mr Oakes called his colleague and asked him to shut down some different machinery, I believe it was the spaleck screens. The noise then dissipated, I collected another video to demonstrate this. Mr Oakes then received a phone call from Mr George Harvey, Mr Oakes described the noise as “being a little noisy today” but there was no evidence of dust in the area. Mr Oakes then informed me that all the dust suppression plans had been carried out and there was no dust issues on site. He informed me he would investigate the machinery for any breaches or malfunctions but it could be the wind direction.'

Other comments

The officer witnessed suspended solids running off the site into the road drain. This was discussed with Mr Oakes at the time who advised that the road drain then went into the field. This will be investigated during the next inspection so please ensure all drainage on site is in line with what is in the permit and that there are no unpermitted discharges from site.
