4. Details of our assessment

On Friday 2nd December 2021, DCWW reported the following in an OPNOT:

"Intermediate pump 2 failed to pump, yesterday evening (02/12/2021) This caused site to go into bypass mode. MEI standby operator attended site. Resolved issue with pump and reset. Site operating as normal.

Issue resolved same evening. All issues were resolved. Site operating as designed.”.

According to further details within the report, the issue was resolved within three hours. This was later confirmed by Performance Manager, Sean Howard, during a site inspection of Cog Moors WwTW operations (Final Effluent, Storm and Emergency permits), on 16th December 2021. During the inspection, the interstage (aka intermediate) pumping station was fully operational. Therefore, supporting that a successful repair of the pumping station was completed prior to the inspection.

Sean also stated, that when the site was operating in “bypass mode” for three hours during repairs on 02/12/2021, it would have been discharging via the storm discharge route. A discharge of this nature is only permitted if the conditions in the site’s Emergency Permit (AN0280003) are met.

During the inspection (16/12/2021), Cog Moors WwTW was not operating in emergency conditions.

ACTIONS:

NRW will require the following information to determine compliance with the site’s Emergency Permit:

1. What was the cause of the pump failure?
2. When Pump 2 failed, why did the assist and standby pumps **not** kick in?
3. Please provide maintenance records/program for interstage pumps from Jan 2019 to Jan 2022.
4. When the site is running in “bypass mode”, does the flow pass through or bypass the storm tanks prior to discharge?

Deadline for providing the information above is Friday 18th March 2022.
