SCHEDULE - CONDITIONS RELATING TO THIS MODIFICATION

Modification of conditions under section 37(1)(a) as follows:

1.2 Permitted Wastes

Permitted categories and types of wastes

1.2.1 No wastes other than those which are both categorised below in table 1.2 and specified in detail in section 1(e) of the working plan shall be accepted at the site.

Permitted Quantities of waste

1.2.2 The quantities of waste accepted shall not exceed those listed in Table 1.2 and specified in detail in section 1(e) of the working plan. Whilst complying with the maximum quantities specified for each type of waste, the total quantity of waste accepted at the site per year shall not exceed 74,999 tonnes

7.2 **Records of Waste movements**

Recording of wastes accepted and removed

7.2.1 A record shall be kept of all wastes received and of all materials (wastes and recovered materials) removed from the site. The records shall include the following for each vehicle load of waste/material:

For waste received:

- (a) origin of waste
- (b) date received
- (c) quantities in tonnes received and waste types
- (d) nature of the waste (solid, liquid or sludge)

for waste/material removed:

- (e) date removed
- (f) quantities in tonnes removed and waste and/or material type
- (g) destination of waste and/or material removed
- (h) nature of the waste and/or materials (solid, liquid or sludge)

7.2.2 A summary of the information, including nil returns, shall be submitted to the Agency, in the format specified by the Agency in Annex I which forms part of this condition. Summaries shall be for each quarter of the financial year and shall be submitted to the Agency within one month of the end of each quarter.

Add new Condition(s)

1.2 Permitted Wastes

Permitted categories and types of wastes

1.2.1 No wastes other than those which are both categorised below in table 1.2 and specified in detail in Appendix A of this licence shall be accepted at the site.

Permitted Quantities of waste

1.2.2 The quantities of waste accepted shall not exceed those listed in Table 1.2 and specified in Appendix B of this licence. Whilst complying with the maximum quantities specified for each type of waste, the total quantity of waste accepted at the site per year shall not exceed 74,999 tonnes

Records of waste movements

Recording of wastes accepted and removed

7.2.1 A record shall be kept of all wastes and of all wastes removed from the site. The records shall include the following for each vehicle load of waste:

for waste received:

- (a) origin of waste
- (b) date received
- (c) quantities in tonnes received and waste type
- (d) nature of the waste (solid, liquid or sludge)

for waste removed:

- (e) date removed
- (f) quantities in tonnes removed and waste type
- (g) destination of waste removed
- (h) nature of the waste (solid, liquid or sludge)

Summary records of wastes accepted and removed

7.2.2 A summary record of the waste types and quantities accepted and removed from the site shall be made for each quarter of the financial year and shall be submitted to the Agency within one month of the end of that quarter. The summary record shall be in the format detailed in Appendix A or otherwise subsequently specified by the Agency in writing.

RIGHTS OF APPEAL

Section 43(1) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 provides that:

Where, except in pursuance of a direction given by the Secretary of State, the conditions of a licence are modified, the licence holder may appeal from the decision to the Secretary of State.

A statement of the grounds of appeal;

A copy of any application to modify the licence

A copy of the licence;

A copy of any correspondence relevant to the appeal;

A copy of any other document relevant to the appeal including, in particular, any relevant consent, determination, notice, planning permission, established use certificate or certificate of lawful use or development and

A statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or on the basis of written representations.

You are also required to serve a copy of your notice of appeal, together with copies of any the above documents that have accompanied your notice of appeal, on the Environment Agency (at the address overleaf). You should appeal within 6 months of the date that this notice takes effect but the Secretary of State may allow notice of appeal to be given after the expiry of this time period.
