The site was inspected by Sally Wakeford and Ffion Thomas on 24 August 2016. Thank you to Carlie and Steve for meeting us and showing us around the site.

The site was still operating outside the permit boundary.

You are currently under a Regulation 38 Notice to comply with your permit for this breach. As per page 10 of our Compliance Classification Scoring Guidance document where a notice has been served and a non-compliance is so complex that it requires longer than six months to rectify (large amount of soil to be moved into the existing boundary) then we shall recommence active scoring after 6 months to reflect our ongoing effort at the site.

As such you have been given a score of C2 - Management system & operating procedures – CAT3 breach – Permit condition 1.1.1.

We understand it is still your intention to vary the permit, dependant on the intentions of the landlords. Please note we will require a certain amount of time for the variation to be issued, this can take up to approximately 4 months.

MCERTS Certified Laboratory & Testing

You informed me you use QTS Environmental for your testing of aggregates. However you also have a lab on site for testing the grading of materials. QTS is MCERTS/UKAS accredited no 4480.

Please provide evidence that the materials leaving site have conformed to BSEN13242 or 600/800 Highway Works, to ensure compliance with the WRAP Quality Protocol for Aggregates. Samples of testing documents will ensure that the materials leaving site have met end of waste, and therefore no waste transfer controls are necessary.

Please provide this evidence by 14 October 2016.

Waste returns

Your recent waste returns show that no waste has left site, I understand that you have metal skips leaving the site. You informed me this was an omission – please ensure that all wastes leaving the site in future are captured in your waste returns – including metal or any other quarantined waste etc.

Factory Production Control document.

WRAP Quality Protocol for Aggregates requires operators to review their Factory Production Control (FPC) document regularly.

The latest one I hold is WRAP QP for Stenor 2009.doc. You informed me that this document is still relevant and up to date. Please ensure this is regularly reviewed.

Any compliance criteria not highlighted in the above summary should be considered as not assessed.

In this document 'Natural Resources Wales' means the Natural Resource Body for Wales established by Article 3 of the Natural Resource Body for Wales (Establishment) Order 2012.
