This was the first visit to the site since the permit was issued.

Our permitting team had already contacted the permit holder that the permit EPR/AB3698CV for Airfield Metals Limited, Carew Airfield for SR2008 No20 – Vehicle storage, depollution and dismantling (authorised treatment) facility was issued in error. This was due to the site being unable to meet the location requirements of the standard rules permit – namely the activities shall not be carried out within Groundwater Source Protection Zone 1. The site is located within a SPZ 1, and unfortunately this was not picked up during our initial location screen checks.

As a result of this the permit holder was given two options:

1. Apply to vary the permit to become a bespoke permit providing all the relevant supporting information. This would be at a reduced cost as we would take the SRP fee off the OPRA variation fee.
2. Apply to vary the permit to become a bespoke permit. At a reduced cost to yourselves taking the SRP off the OPRA variation fee. We would send you the Generic Risk Assessment with the sections you cannot comply with (SPZ 1 proximity) left blank and ask that they outline what measures you will have in place to protect/prevent harm etc. to the source protection zone. We would then include a number of improvement conditions requiring you to submit all of the necessary management plans (including Environmental Management system, Fire prevention and mitigation plan) to NRW within a set time frame.

These options were discussed with Mr Jones during the visit and he stated that Option 1 was his preferred choice. Mr Jones stated that he would inform the permitting team of this.

No ELV's were present on site during this visit.

ELV depollution equipment such as vacuum tanks had been purchased and were on site.

Mr Jones was given advice on waste storage e.g. all liquid wastes from the ELV's must be stored separately in suitable containers, clearly marked and in a bunded area.

Mr Jones was advised to seek guidance from the HSE regarding the suitability of the depollution area e.g he needs to seek clarification whether the pit could be used in its current state.

Following this inspection our permitting team notified us that Mr Jones had been given until the end of May to submit an application for the bespoke permit.
