

Management, Storage and Handling Review /waste

Farm: Tregare Turkeys Ltd

On farm waste has been significantly reduced in the past 2 years, reduction examples include the delivery of bedding material in bulk containers, previously, these were wrapped in polythene in 25kg bales, plastic chemical receptacles are recycled by returning the empty, washed containers back to the suppliers.

The business will continue to review the waste it produces, the initial aim will be to reduce the amount of waste produced, it will look to recycle or re-use where it is possible and finally continuously consider the disposal options.

Waste records

Waste transfer notes are kept on site provided by approved waste contractors for off-site reuse or disposal; these records include the nature, origin and volume of the transferred waste. These records are carefully assessed and filed. Before any contractor is used, their carrier certification and waste management licences (where required) are first checked and then recorded. In this regard Tregare is compliant with the requirements of Duty of Care.

Storage Areas

The table below details the waste streams generated within the installation, where they are generated and where they are stored.

Waste storage areas are deliberately located away from sensitive boundaries and watercourses.

No waste is stored on site for a period in excess of twelve months.

Disposal of carcasses

Poultry carcasses are disposed of in accordance with the Animal By-Product Order of 2003. Mortalities will be recorded and removed from the sheds on a daily basis. Currently Tregare operates a storage, bagging and collection system.

In the case of high mortalities resulting from a disease, carcasses will be collected by an authorized haulier/renderer as and when required.

All farm disposals, both Hazardous and Non-Hazardous waste has been carried out in compliance with Regulations.

Currently, it has been considered, that no further changes will be made.
