Officer Jonathan LEE in attendance of SIMS Group UK Limited, East Moors Road, Cardiff to complete a compliance inspection of the environmental permit EPR-RP3392EY.

Given the non-operational status of the facility, the visit was made to discuss the surrender of the environmental permit with the operator and complete a final inspection of the permitted area.

Weather was mild with light rain at the time of the inspection.

Inspection

There were no waste materials or machinery present within the permitted area at the time of the inspection (see photo 1). Site activities had clearly ceased.

There was a minor quantity of broken concrete panels present on site. It was stated that the operator was seeking removal of these materials as soon as possible.

The impermeable surface present within the site building and on the main yard area was in good condition. No ongoing pollution risk to ground or water was identifiable at time of the inspection.

No compliance breaches were identified during the inspection.

Permit Surrender

With consideration of the inspection observations and having reviewed historical site information, it is recommended that a **low risk surrender** application be submitted to Natural Resources Wales.

Application forms Parts A, E2, F1 and CC1 should be submitted alongside a H5 Site Condition Report completed in line with the H5 Guidance as part of the surrender application.
