4. Details of our assessment

This report details the site visit carried out on Tuesday 15th February at BIFFA, The Recycling Centre, Dyffryn Business Park of the permit EPR-XP3295FK. Officers Anna WILMSHURST, Alex BOWDER and Craig COLEMAN attended site between 14:30 and 15:00 to complete a routine compliance inspection and for new regulatory officer Anna WILMSHURST to meet site managers. Weather was overcast and dry, although it had been raining heavily all morning. Officers met with Kathryn EVANS (TCM and site manager) and Adrian PITMAN (supervisor), who gave officers a site tour.

Actions from last site visit – 17th March 2020

To remind the company following each visit Natural Resources Wales will produce a Compliance Assessment Report (CAR) detailing our comments from the inspection. If we substantiate reasonably foreseeable risks or actual impact to the environment, we can breach the business against your permit conditions which can affect your site banding and annual subsistence fees; this is scored on a Category 1 - 4 basis:

- 1 - Major, serious persistent and/or extensive impact on the environment/people/property
- 2 – Significant impact on effect on the environment/people/property

3 – Minor impact or effect on the environment/people/property

4 – A non-compliance which has no potential environmental effect

General observations

Officers received a site tour and the following observations were made. Waste is segregated, with mixed waste material stored inside and construction and demolition waste outside. It was noted that there was a fire on site within one of the buildings some years ago.

Infrastructure and drainage - the site is on an impermeable base, which appeared to be in good condition. The site drains to an interceptor, which is serviced every 6 months and emptied when required. The site also has a discharge point to the Rhymney River. Issues at the sample point were noted last year and an extensive clean out of the interceptor was undertaken. The sample point is managed by the local environment team.

Technical competency - the site TCM is Kathryn Evans. The latest WAMITAB certificate we have on the system for Kathryn Evans expired 03/02/22. ACTION: Please submit up to date competency certificate.

Waste returns

Waste returns must be submitted to NRW quarterly, within one month of the end of each quarter. Kathryn Evans is responsible for submitting waste returns for the site. The maximum total quantity of waste accepted at the site per year shall not exceed 74,99 tonnes. The latest waste return for Q4 of 2021 was submitted on 12/01/22 and states that 6093.092 tonnes were accepted by the site, and 6852.414 tonnes were removed. Waste returns appear to be up to date and within permit limits. Please continue to submit these in line with your permit. We appear to be missing Q1 2021, could you please send this through for our records?

Please continue to submit waste returns within one month of the end of each quarter in line with your permit conditions.

Permit compliance and breaches

No permit non-compliances were identified on this visit and thus no breaches have been scored.
