Warning letter

Dear Sir,

**Metech Recycling (UK) Ltd. Unit 49 Hirwaun Industrial Estate, Aberdare. SF44 9UP,
Permit reference EPR/DP3598FP**

We believe that you have committed the following offence:

Offence: Regulation 32(2) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2010 in which you failed to comply with permit conditions by storing waste incorrectly and accepting non-permitted waste.

Date: between 26 May 2016 and 7 September 2016

We have issued this **warning letter** as a response to the above offence on this occasion. However, our decision could change if any further relevant information comes to light, including, but not restricted to, information that:

- you have committed earlier offences;
- the environmental impacts of this offence is greater than we presently understand them;
- the offences are continuing or have been repeated;
- you have committed other offences of which we are presently unaware.

We will take this offence into account if we consider that you are involved in any future offending.

This warning does not:

- prevent any other prosecuting authority taking action against you; or
- affect our right to issue enforcement, clear-up or remediation notices, or seek recovery of costs or damages according to law.
