MARINE AND COASTAL ACCESS ACT 2009: PART 4 – MARINE LICENSING

LICENCE FOR PEMBROKE DOCK INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT

I am pleased to advise you that the Marine Licensing Team within Natural Resources Wales, on behalf of the Welsh Ministers, as Licensing Authority, has considered Milford Haven Port Authorities application dated 23 November 2021 requesting a variation to a Marine Licence under Part 4 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, and hereby grant the Marine Licence for you to undertake the above stated works.

Accordingly, please find attached for your review and retention a copy of Marine Licence **CML2057v1** and its conditions. Please note that Marine Licence **CML2057v1** supersedes Marine Licence **CML2057** in its entirety.

The licence has been varied to include the installation of a temporary stank (stacked containers) and a revised slipway design to include a secant piled wall on the boundary of the slipway.

Advisory Note

Please note in particular the amendments to the following sections of Marine Licence **CML2057v1**:

- Table 1 Licenced Activities
- The addition of **Condition 3.23.2** to ensure that actions outlined in the approved CEMP followed.
- The addition of **Condition 3.25** to minimise the risk to the marine environment through the use of concrete.

Marine Licence, **CML2057v1**, constitutes a statutory consent; therefore the conditions set out herein must be complied with in full and will be binding upon any agent or contractor who undertakes any activity on the project on your behalf.

Marine Licence, **CML2057v1** is solely granted for the work to be undertaken with the area specified in the Licence; however, it does not absolve you from applying for further consents or licences as necessary to enable the full completion of your project.

If the works authorised by this Licence are unlikely to be completed by the expiry date, the Licence Holder should apply for a routine variation for a possible extension of the Licence period **at least 2 months** prior to the expiry date.

For a replacement marine licence or a formal complex variation, the Licence Holder should apply **at least 4 months** prior to the expiry date of this Licence.

Should you require clarification as to the reasons for the inclusion of any of the conditions attached to the Licence then you must request written notice within 28 days of the receipt of this letter.

Finally, once again, please ensure you have read and understood Marine Licence **CML2057v1**. Should you have any queries with regards to your Marine Licence then please do not hesitate to contact the Marine Licensing Team.

Following the UK's departure from the EU on 31 January 2020 and the end of the transition period on 31 December 2020, the legal obligations relating to compliance with environmental permits and legislation will continue to apply. NRW will continue to issue and regulate all permits and licenses in line with our current practice.
