**ENFORCEMENT NOTICE TO TAKE SPECIFIED STEPS IN RELATION TO A
BREACH/ANTICIPATED BREACH OF PERMIT CONDITION(S)**

Environmental permit: EPR/BB3096CB

Regulated facility: Barry Plant, Dock 2, Atlantic Way, Barry, Vale of Glamorgan, CF63 3RA

Natural Resources Wales considers that the following conditions of the environmental permit are being contravened:

2.1 Permitted activities

2.1.1 The operator is only authorised to carry out the operations specified in table 2.1 ("the activities").

Storage of wastes listed in table 2.4 shall not exceed 10,000 tonnes in total at any one time.

All other wastes stored shall not exceed 40,000 tonnes in total at any one time.

Because the volume of waste that is currently stored on site is in excess of the tonnages specified in the permit.

2.3 Waste acceptance

2.3.1 Waste shall only be accepted if:

(a) it is of a type listed in table 2.3; (b) it conforms to the description in the documentation supplied by the producer and holder; (c) its chemical, physical and biological characteristics make it suitable for its intended treatment; (d) any excavated soil from potentially contaminated sites has been shown by prior chemical analysis and assessment to be suitable for the intended use without significant risk of pollution; and (e) it is visually inspected on arrival and before it enters the treatment process to ensure that it complies with these standard rules.

2.3.2. Any waste that does not comply with 2.3.1 shall be rejected and shall be; (a) removed from the site; or (b) moved to a designated quarantine area pending removal

Because you have accepted wastes which are not covered by the permitted waste types and would not be suitable for treatment under the permitted activities, namely waste fines from a metal

treatment facility and carpet underlay/running track waste, and have failed to remove these from site as actioned in CAR form reference CAR_NRW0034840.

You are required to take the steps set out in Schedule 1 by the date(s) specified in order to remedy the contravention.

General

1. Failure to comply with this notice is an offence under Regulation 38(3) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016 and may result in legal action being taken against you.
2. Without prejudice to the requirements of this notice, failure to comply with a condition of an environmental permit is an offence and may result in legal action being taken against you.
3. You may wish to seek independent legal advice.

Appeal provisions

You are entitled to appeal against this notice under Regulation 31(1)(f) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016. Notice of appeal must be made within two months of the date of this notice. An appeal does not affect the requirements of this notice.

The required documents are:

- A statement of the grounds of appeal
- A copy of any relevant application
- A copy of any relevant environmental permit
- A copy of any relevant correspondence between the appellant and the regulator
- A copy of any decision or notice which is the subject matter of the appeal
- A statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or dealt with by way of written representations.

You may withdraw an appeal by notifying The Planning Inspectorate in writing and sending a copy of that notification to Natural Resources Wales. Further information about making an appeal and the forms that you will need are available from The Planning Inspectorate detailed above.

Legislation note

In this document "Natural Resources Wales" means the Natural Resources Body for Wales established by Article 3 of the Natural Resources Body for Wales (Establishment) Order 2012. On 01 April 2013 the Natural Resources Body for Wales (Functions) Order 2013 transferred the relevant functions of the Countryside Council for Wales, and functions of the Environment Agency and the Forestry Commission in Wales to the Natural Resources Body for Wales.
