4. Details of our assessment

CARS - Apteco Limited, Conwy

The HEP scheme is licenced by abstraction licence WA/366/0008/0008 and Impoundment licence WA/366/0008/0009

This report is in reference to the Impoundment Licence WA/366/0008/0009

The Apteco Limited Hydro on the Afon Abrach site was visited on the 19.1.2022 by Environment Officer Swyn Spencer and Paul Morgan Land Management Officer at NRW. The weather was cloudy but dry. The scheme was abstracting on the day of the inspection.

The following compliances were noted:

Condition 2.1; point of impoundment as per licence. Correct Grid Reference.

Condition 4.5; This notch was clear during the visit. Therefore complying with the condition as in the impoundment licence: Please ensure that the HOF flow channel is kept clear. As in the impoundment licence: *'The licence holder shall construct, operate and maintain the intake works in accordance with the specification and drawings referred to in Condition 3.1 of the licence and keep them free from leakage and obstruction at all times'*.

To ensure compliance with the licence and protect the environment, you need to make sure that you maintain the intake works in accordance with the specifications and drawings referred to in condition 3.1: *Intake works consisting of a concrete weir reinforced with prefabricated steel wingwalls incorporating an 'abstraction weir' and a 'compensation weir', intake screen with spacing no greater than 1 millimetre, steel intake tank, 250 millimetre internal diameter gravity feed penstock pipe, Hof Notch and eel tile in accordance with the specification drawing.*

This is in order to protect the ecology in the downstream watercourse, and to ensure continuation of compliance. Thank you for ensuring the Hof notch is clear.

Measurements were made to the abstraction screen, residual flow area of the intake, and they were correct as per licence.

The diagrams on the licences demonstrates an Eel pass, and this is compliant on the scheme.

4.8 No plunge pool present. A breach is recorded. Please contact Natural Resources Wales regarding this part of the licence, as a variation will be needed via the permitting service. In order to avoid further breaches. Please also include environment officer Swyn Spencer in your correspondence.
