Introductory note

This introductory note does not form a part of the notice

The following notice gives notice of the variation of an environmental permit.

This variation is to add waste codes for mixed food and green waste, biodegradable kitchen and canteen waste and sanitary wastes comprising of nappies, sanitary bin waste and dog fouling waste.

All other conditions varied in or added to the permit have been done in order to allow the acceptance of the new waste types.

The permit has not been consolidated into an updated format, at the request of the operator.

The schedules specify the changes made to the original permit.

Schedule B- Types of Waste and Quantity

1. Types of wastes to be accepted at the facility (subject to the exclusions specified below):
 - a. Household, commercial and industrial waste as defined in the Environmental Protection Act 1990 Section 75 and Regulations made there under; and
 - b. Wastes as listed in Appendix 1.
2. Only solid waste including cement or resin bonded asbestos waste produced and delivered to the site by the householder, shall be deposited the facility with the exemption of:
 - a. Waste oil delivered by householders as civic amenity waste.
 - b. Solvent based paints and thinners deposited as household waste at the civic amenity site.
 - c. Liquid waste arising from road sweepings and gully emptying operations deposited within the area edged in red on plan reference DF12 dated 11/08/98 and attached to this licence.
 - d. Biodegradable kitchen and canteen waste.
 - e. Mixed green and food waste.
 - f. Comprising of nappies, wastes from sanitary bins and dog fouling waste from parks only.

Schedule C- Conditions

47 Operating techniques

- 47.1 (a) The activities shall, subject to the conditions of this permit, be operated using the techniques and in the manner described in the documentation specified in table S1.1, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Environment Agency.
- (b) If notified by the Environment Agency that the activities are giving rise to pollution, the operator shall submit to the Environment Agency for approval within the period specified, a revision of any plan specified in table S1.1 or otherwise required under this permit which identifies and minimises the risks of pollution relevant to that plan, and shall implement the approved revised plan in place of the original from the date of approval, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Environment Agency.

50 Odour

- 50.1 Emissions from the activities shall be free from odour at levels likely to cause pollution outside the site, as perceived by an authorised officer of the Environment Agency, unless the operator has used appropriate measures, including, but not limited to, those specified in any approved odour management plan, to prevent or where that is not practicable to minimise the odour.
