3c The partial transfer is to allow the expansion of the adjoining household waste site, this will require a variation of the waste transfer station permit (WML34115) to define the new boundary and a separate 'normal' variation will be submitted for the household site (WML34187) to incorporate the transferred area as well as updating the existing waste management licence to a modern style permit which reflects current waste activities, infrastructure, layout, etc.

4b WAMITAB certificate for Pete Malvern (TCM)

4d As previously mentioned the transferred area will be incorporated into the existing household waste site through a 'normal' variation and the sites' management system will be updated accordingly.

As stated in the EMS for the household site: Waste operations onsite are directed by a Technically Competent Manager in conjunction with the operations at Rheidol Recycling Park which shares a common boundary. The TCM holds a suitable award to manage both sites (with certified Continuing Competence through WAMITAB) and is in attendance for over the required minimum of 20% of operational hours, attendance is recorded in the site diary at Rheidol Recycling Park.

The last NRW compliance audit of the EMS for the site was conducted on 04/12/2015

Any existing permit breach/compliance concerns for the household site will be addressed by increasing its size through incorporating the transferred area and through updating the licence to reflect changes since the licence was originally issued.
