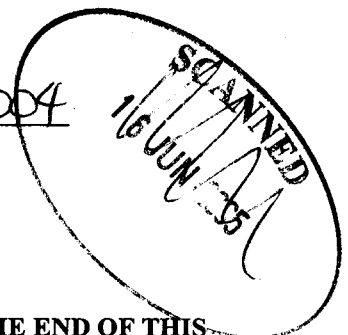
AND WHEREAS on 23 March 1999 the Agency modified the licence pursuant to Section 37 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990

RIGHTS OF APPEAL

Section 43(1) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 provides that:

Where, except in pursuance of a direction given by the National Assembly for Wales, the conditions of a licence are modified, the licence holder may appeal from the decision to the National Assembly for Wales.

Therefore, if you feel aggrieved by the decision detailed on the attached notice, you may obtain the appropriate form on which to give written notice of an appeal from :-

This notice of appeal should be accompanied by the following information:

A statement of the grounds of appeal; a copy of any application to modify the licence; a copy of the licence; a copy of any correspondence relevant to the appeal; a copy of any other document relevant to the appeal including, in particular, any relevant consent, determination, notice, planning permission, established use certificate or certificate of lawful use or development; and a statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or on the basis of written representations.

You are also required to serve a copy of your notice of appeal, together with copies of any the above documents that have accompanied your notice of appeal, on the Environment Agency (at the address overleaf). You should appeal within 6 months of the date that this notice takes effect but the National Assembly for Wales may allow notice of appeal to be given after the expiry of this time period.

Definitions

In these conditions and their interpretation, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms have the specified meanings:

"accepted"

for waste being delivered to the site, shall mean accepted as waste input to the site for storage and/or processing and/or disposal under the specified waste management operations;

"European Waste Catalogue" or "EWC"

means commission Decision 200/532/EC (as amended) or its subsequent replacement";

"inert waste"

means wastes which will not undergo any significant physical, chemical or biological transformations. Inert waste will not dissolve, burn or otherwise physically or chemically react, biodegrade or adversely affect other matter with which it comes into contact in a way likely to give rise to environmental pollution or harm to human health. The total leachability and pollutant content of the waste and the ecotoxicity of the leachate must be insignificant and in particular not endanger the quality of surface water and/or groundwater;

"sealed container"

means a container which does not permit either the ingress or egress of liquids, or the escape of dusts or wastes contained within it;

"specified waste management operations"

means the waste management operations authorised by condition 1.1 of this licence;

"the site"

means the land, structures, plant and equipment to which this licence relates;

"waste"

means controlled waste as defined in section 75(4) of the 1990 Act and the Controlled Waste Regulations 1992 or any statutory provisions or regulations amending or replacing them;

"waste types"

"hazardous waste"

means any waste which is covered by Article 1(4) of Directive 91/689/EEC or subsequent legislation;

"Non-hazardous waste"

means any waste which is not covered by Article 1(4) of Directive 91/689/EEC or subsequent legislation;

Schedule B

B.1 Specified waste management operations

- B.1.1 No waste management operations shall be authorised by this licence unless:
- specified in and undertaken in accordance with the limitations in the following table; or
 - otherwise required by the conditions of this licence as being an integral part of those operations;

Specified Waste Management Operations and Exempt Waste Management Operations

- B.1.2 Where wastes are being brought onto the site for waste management operations which are exempt from licensing under the 1994 Regulations, then the wastes which are subject to the specified waste management operations shall be kept clearly segregated and identified from those wastes which are being kept on the site for the exempt waste management operations.
